PREPARE THE WORK

Pre-requirements before gluing:

- The temperatures of the surfaces to be assembled and of the ambient air must be above 10°C and below 35°C.
- For any given temperature, the relative humidity level must be 5% below the dewpoint level on the surfaces to be glued.
- The surfaces to be glued must be free of all traces of moisture.
- The area around the glazing must be free of dust.



Ensure that the silicone is not perished and that it has been stored in a cool and dry place.





Make sure to always use FIX-IN SA surface activator when glass has SAFE+ safety film on the back.

(S-F) = Need safety film when applied with FIX-IN SL.
(S-W) = To be applied on uniform white painted background only.
(M) = Mechanical fixing only (see Installation Guide for more details).

NEW CONSTRUCTION

PREPARE THE SUBSTRATE



Check and ensure wall flatness and evenness. Clean dust from wall with a brush.

Apply FIX-IN PR wall primer on porous surfaces and let it dry. Some Lacobel and Matelac colours require a uniform painted background (see p. 3). No wall primer needed in case of white painted background.






Paint a narrow line (max 1cm) on the joint areas in colours matching the glass and let it dry.



SAFETY FILM PREPARATION



• If SAFE+ safety film is present on the back of glass: Apply FIX-IN SA surface activator always in the same direction (from left to right or from right to left, without rubbing it) and clean the back with a dry cloth.



• If no safety film is present, no surface activator is needed. Start bonding the glass.

Apply additional silicone close to cut-outs and holes.

Remove protection film from FIX-IN AT and use setting blocks to support glass.





Start installation at outer edge. Position and adjust the sheet whilst floating on silicone.





Use metal profiles for outer corners to improve the resistance.





Allow at least 48h drying time before removing setting blocks.

REFURBISHMENT

PREPARE THE SUBSTRATE



Check tiles for hollow areas, remove loose parts.





Check and ensure wall flatness and evenness.





Clean tiles with water + a drop of ammonia (NH₄OH).






Paint the wall on the joint areas in colours matching the glass and let it dry. Some Lacobel and Matelac colours require a uniform white painted background (see p. 3).



SAFETY FILM PREPARATION

 If SAFE+ safety film is present on the back of glass: Apply FIX-IN SA surface activator always in the same direction (from left to right or from right to left, without rubbing it) and clean the back with a dry cloth.



TIPS & TRICKS

- 1. To easily rectify the placement of large sheets of glass during installation:
 - a) apply FIX-IN AT 10 cm above the lower edge of the sheet
 - b) apply FIX-IN SL in vertical lines or in dots larger than the FIX-IN AT (3.21 mm).
- 2. Silicone FIX-IN SL can also be used for sealing joints.
- 3. If there are traces of silicone on the glass side, products for cleaning silicone on glass (including matt glass) can be purchased on the site <u>www.agc-store.com</u>. These products can be used to remove dry silicone as well as fresh silicone. A video of this easy and effective cleaning process can be viewed on the home page of the site.
